
We hail thee, Alma Mater, dear, as now we sing thy praise;

HISTORY OF RED HILL HIGH SCHOOL

Prior to 1904, the majority of the children in this community were educated in the home of J. N. Faris of Red Hill. There were about sixty pupils enrolled in school at this time.

Realizing the need for a larger place of instruction, the people of the community got together and decided to build a much needed school. A site was chosen for the school and Mr. Rothwell gave the land. This was undertaken in 1904 and classes were begun formally in 1905.

The first building was frame. It had three rooms on the first floor and an auditorium on the second floor. This building was made possible by the contributions of the people of the community. This school had three teachers, but within a year the number was increased to four, and the auditorium was used as a classroom.

The faculty consisted of four members until the spring of 1918 when one more was added. During the summer of 1918, the community raised funds to employ six teachers and to make other improvements in order that the school might be accredited.

In January, 1919, a fire of undisclosed origin completely leveled the school building. However, a temporary building was put up and the pupils were back in school in about a week's time.

The present brick building, erected by funds contributed by the people of the community, Mr. Paul G. McIntire, and the Albemarle School Board, was opened in 1922.

Two new classrooms and a library were added during the session 1933-34. Beginning the session 1934, a Domestic Science Department was placed in Red Hill School. It soon became apparent that even greater expansion was necessary, so in the spring of 1950 the building was still further enlarged and modernized with a spacious cafeteria and auditorium.

This improvement was greatly aided by a large gift from local residents who asked that their names remain a secret.

The enrollment has increased steadily each year until there are now approximately 356 pupils on roll and fourteen members in the faculty.

THE FIRST GRADUATING CLASS

Red Hill High School was established in 1905 but there were no graduates until 1910.

This first graduating was unusual in that its six members were three sets of sisters and brothers.

They were James G. White and Miss India White; Edge Faris and Miss Mattie Faris; Byrd Hart and Miss Elizabeth Hart.

The three men are now deceased.

Miss India White lives at "Anchor-age"; Miss Faris, now Mrs. John Wheeler, lives at Arrington, Virginia; and Miss Hart, now Mrs. Elizabeth Kelley, lives in Charlottesville.

Four of these six first-graduates went on to college. Miss White and Mrs. Kelley went to Farmville State Teachers College and Mr. Faris and Mr. Hart graduated from the University of Virginia in medicine and engineering respectively.

Miss Winkie Smith, Class of 1923, is an alumna of West Hampton College, and is with the U. S. Printing Office in Washington, D. C.

Edwin Smith, Class of 1927, of Charlottesville, attended VPI, and owns the Smith Land & Lumber Company at North Garden.

Virginia Smith, now Mrs. I. J. Friedman of Levittown, New York, graduated in 1929 and received her nurse's training at Garfield Hospital in Washington.

Jacob Smith, honor graduate of 1933, was a Warrant Officer in the Marine Corps during World War II, later graduated with honors in Animal Husbandry from Mississippi State College and now lives in Jackson, Mississippi.

Comer Smith, Class of 1935, is in the lumber business with his brother, Edwin, and is the present treasurer of the R. H. P. T. A. He has two children attending Red Hill School.

The Napiers have also had eight children to graduate from Red Hill, and they also have a daughter, Lucille, in this year's graduating class.
